

Fun day with boomerangs

THE Boomerang Association of Australia will hold at boomerang fun day at the Loyola Rd Reserve in Werribee on Sunday 30 May.

Some of the best throwers in the world will attend and newcomers are also welcome to attend.

Bruce Carter, 15, who is the current junior champion, will also be there.

Everybody is welcome to attend the fun day. The entry fee is \$2 and entertainment is guaranteed. Inquiries: 300 2374.

Also this story, if you can it that was in the paper 2 weeks before the event... So it was quite expected, when only 3 locals participated in this Fun Day (all 3 are boom throwers who knew the day was on anyway!) On the day, it was fairly windy and 15 throwers took to the field. -The teams were Kempy's Catastrophies, Foley's Few (renamed Wally's Winmps) Crolly's Crawlers... Team Accuracy was the first event - we had a witches hat in the centre - and there was 20 bonus points if this was hit by a boomerang. each thrower had 5 throws - regular comp throwers had to make their boom travel 30 metres, which made their scoring a bit hardere... Rob Crolls team, was making it tough for their opposition, by scoring heavily in this event. nick Gottschalk, using a Bunny Read made boomerang scored a bullseye and the other team memers, Rob, Ben Whykes, Bazza harrison, Rohan Johnston were also doing well. On the final round of 5 throws, Wally's Wimps - and former BAA original member Miles Jorgensen, not only scored a Bullseye, but had his boom resting against the witches hat in the middle of the centre circle... A win in the first event to Wally's Wimps.

The 2nd event was Rope a Dope which consisted of two throwers running around holding a piece of rope – attempting to catch boomerangs..... This event was all tied (no pun intented) after 3 minutes each of throwing, so the points were evenly divided.

Event No 3 Hornet handpass which meant that EVERY TEAM used one hornet, threw it took the catch and passed it on to their team mates... Most catches in 5 minutes meant the winning team... Kempy"s catastrophies clearly had the most catches – but as was to be confirmed later in the day – Kempy proved to be a expert at A) bending rules to sit his team and B) Blatantly Cheat!!! – but we must add that his well chosen team

This trend was to continue for the next couple of events and although Kempys mob won the relay it was not enough to stop Wallys Wimps being declared the Overall Champs.... Rob Croll donated a Gregg Snouffer Tantrum to everybody in the runners up team, and the winning members each received a Trueflight Competition Hook....

The day was enjoyed by all, and now Miles hopes to organise another of these days in the near future in Box Hill in Melbourne... Also Nick Gottschalk, might be able to plan one for Bairnsdale...

Brother, let's have a fling!





NIGHT BOOMBRANGS (BET) BIT UP IN MELBOURNE

It was the first Friday night in August, this year, when my folks told us of distant relatives from Swan Hill that were in Melbourne for the weekend. I hastily organised half a dozen of the local teenagers to join us at 7.30 pm for a throw...

A typical Melbourne winters night it was, cold and windy and not real good for night throwing. The tribe of us were out-side, attempting to take some catches in the dark. It was far too windy for the "Rangs" made Funrangs. I only placed small capsules in each wing, so that the large groove could be used as wind breaks.. The first throw was fine, so now I let everybody know that I was about to perform... Suddenly the whole area lit up, just like in the movie "Field of Dreams" I still was not sure what was happening until there was a noise above my head, looking up, all I could see was these two great spot lights on me from the Police Helicopter which was coming down quite low to see what was going on... If it had of been daylight, I believe that I could have hit them with an MTA, but the best thing to do on this night was to try and throw a boomerang with a sparkler on the arms.

We frantically tried and tried to get a sparkler a light, but being from the nice side of Melbourne, it was quite obvious that there was not an arsonist between us. Oh for Roger Perry where my thoughts. At least the helicopter had some good results for us. The young kids where quite frightened, and ran inside, which gave the parents a good excuse to go inside as well. The teenagers where just interested to see where the chopper was off to and who it was going to light up next which left me to pack up and cherish the thought that this was the closest that I could get to performing on stage in front of the big spotlights, but more importantly, it meant that as no one wanted to continue throwing, I could go inside, in time to watch my beloved Bombers belt the Sydney Swans around in the Aussie Rules Football match that was about to be televised...

Adam & I had a meeting with the Sports Executive of Macquarie Uni. last Friday and had a favourable response from him in our bid to use there for the Nationals. We have to put in a formal letter now of request and should get it. We are getting two ovals, one big one and the other not big enough for Aussie Round type stuff. We can get the smaller one for two days, but the bigger one probably only for one day (Sunday), since cricket may be using it. For the past few years, it seems that I have either been writing a) humorous articles for the New Frontiers magazine or b) reporting on the goings on from the Executive side of the BAA.

It is nice to do a short story on boomerangs, where boomerangs become an actual saviour for a little company...To set the story right, I will report on a chance meeting I had with Mrs. Sue Grant.

I was at the South Melbourne market on the 22nd of August, in a stall selling boomerangs. I booked a stall the previous Sunday and although business was pretty ordinary, I decided to give it another chance the following Sunday. Here I was throwing the indoor foam booms around, when a lady (Mrs. Grant) said seeing me throw boomerangs around reminded me of her grandfather. (I did not know that I looked that old!).


So we struck up a conversation and the following true story was told to me...

During the depression years (in the thirties or forties) Mr. William Iggulden owned a small company that employed 11 men. This company called Bentley Manufacturing, was a small firm that made floor clamps, light fittings and a host of other things, but the trouble was that in these trouble some times, no one had the money to buy these luxuries.. Well, they were purchased, but at not much more than cost price, so although the 11 men had work to do, William was not bringing in the required bucks to be able to pay his wonderful workers.. Through the week, William started to shape and cut out boomerangs - not your highly designed super booms but boomerangs of the conventional shape, with leading and trailing wings and a flight that bought them back to the thrower. When the weekends came around, William would board a train and had off to the country for the weekend - not for the piece and quite - no he would go to the bigger country towns, find himself a football field and start throwing his beloved boomerangs around and start entertaining the fascinated crowd that would watch the expert in action. These boomerangs would then be sold to the bystanders, not for much money but still at a profit for William. Come Sunday afternoons and it was time to board the train for the long journey back to Melbourne. Mildura was one place that William would often frequent. This town is over 550 kilometres from Melbourne and yet William did not mind the long trip as he knew that he could always rely on the kindness of the country people to buy his boomerangs which in turn meant that his own work mates could and would be paid for their weeks work. On his many trips to Mildura, William passed through a little town called Wycheproof, some 250 kilometres from Mildura and it is there that the modern boomerang marvel Bunny Read is situated. I'm sure that if William was doing his treks today, he would have to stop in and visit Bunny and I'm sure that the read family would have enjoyed his company. William kept his travelling into the country going for two years so that his men did not have to join the large number of unemployed workers in Melbourne. It is fantastic to hear what Mrs. Grant calls a lovely story and it is terrific to hear how the boomerang proved to be the saviour of the little company. William has sadly passed on now, but through this journal, we hope that his story lives on for ever and encourages people to keep battling through the hard times.

I thank Sue Grant for her story and what pleases me is that now she has heard of the BAA, she has asked for a copy of the magazine to be sent to her and she has even talked about the possibility of joining the BAA.. If she has inherited just some of her Grandfathers determination and boomerang skills, we might just have found our selves another lady champion in the making – but for me just to have her throw a boomerang at a major championship – would make another lovely story

A recommendation that came out of the National Development Officer (NDO) seminar series held earlier this year was that a national conference for NDOs be held in the latter part of 1993. It was generally felt that there was a need to create a forum for NDOs where they could discuss issues and share ideas as well as have topics presented that affect the development of sport within Australia.

Feedback from NDOs was called for on venue, time and workshop topics. Despite some good suggestions for venue, the Australian Sports Commission has been decided on and a date has been set for 17-20 November. We are now looking at what to include on the agenda and are seeking suggestions from sporting organisations as to what they would like to see covered over the three days. I will write to you again in September with a draft agenda and more details on accommodation etc. We are very keen to make this an effective workshop but we need your input to achieve this. I look forward to hearing from you.

NATIONAL SPORTS SERVICE AWARDS

In 1992 the Australian Sports Medicine Federation launched an award scheme aimed at recognising sports medicine professionals working voluntarily for community level sport. The National Sports Service Awards (NSSA) scheme recognise the work of sports medicine professionals who devote many hours, voluntarily assisting in the care of local level athletes and teams.

To be eligible for the award sports medicine professionals must be nominated by a club official, e.g. coach, team manager who provides details about the nominee's involvement with that club or athlete. The main criteria to be used in assessing nominations will be:

- The level of sport that the service is provided i.e., local and regional support is preferable to state or national level
 - Professional activity within the community e.g. giving sports medicine lectures etc.




