Editorial

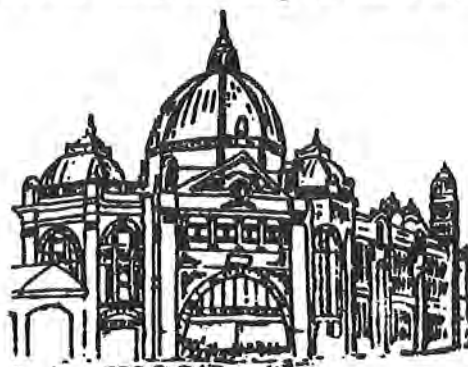

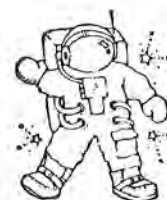

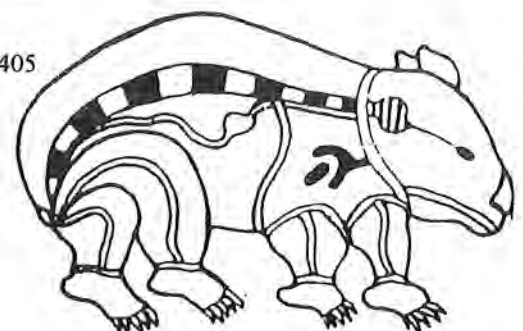

BOOMERANG WORLD CUP 2000

The 9th World Boomerang Championship event held at La Trobe University, Bundoora, Melbourne, Australia. Report by CEO BWC 2000 Committee, Morris Maxwell. Part 1.

TITLE:

It was decided to standardise the title to align with other events of international status eg. Soccer World Cup, Cricket World Cup, etc. This was discussed at a WBA meeting regarding recommendation for future events.

OPENING CEREMONY:

After quite a bit of last minute shuffling, arranging, adjusting and re-arranging, our opening ceremony took place at what worked out to be the most appropriate and successful time on Sunday morning, 6th Feb.

Distinguished Guests and Government Representatives:

WURUNDJERI WELCOMING CEREMONY:

The welcoming ceremony, performed by Murrundindi, elder of the Wurundjeri, with the assistance of Bluey Roberts and Jida, touched the hearts of many present. This took place as follows:

A special fungus is set alight and smolders. Gum leaves are passed through the smoke and these are handed by the elder to each group of visiting boomerang throwers from different countries.

Embodied in the leaf is the local spirit, which gives the bearer right of passage to be on this land.

When leaving the Wurundjeri area, the leaf should be left behind so that the spirit may return to its own land. If the leaf is kept the bearer will be subject to bad luck because the spirit in the leaf will be disoriented if it is removed from its own land.





To enhance the ceremony, Bluey Roberts and Jida performed the "Boomerang Dance" and demonstrated some woomera spear throwing. After his welcome, Murrundindi made the first boomerang throw.

BOOMERANG RETURNED AFTER 165 YEARS

In the early 1830s a group of pioneering farmers formed the "Port Phillip Association" and one of its members, John Batman, gave the Association a "unique concern for the Natives". Later, during 1835, on an expedition to the top of Port Phillip Bay, John Batman met with local Chiefs and, after the exchange of gifts, persuaded them to cut their totem on the bark of a tree and this he copied as signatures onto a deed of conveyance for local tracts of land. Travelling a short distance up the Yarra River, John Batman recorded his now famous statement "This will be the place for a village" thus giving him the popular status as the *founder of Melbourne*.

For our opening ceremony we were honoured with the presence of John Batman Weire, a direct descendant of John Batman, and John brought with him a boomerang that was given to *John Batman* with the exchange of gifts in 1835. We were privileged to witness John present this boomerang to Murrundindi, who is a direct descendant of *Be-be-jern Nurungaeta* (King) of the Wurundjeri who was present at the signing of the treaty with John Batman. Thus a boomerang was returned to its original family owners after one hundred and sixty five years.

LET THE GAMES BEGIN!

After Murrundindi's welcome to the Wurundjeri area and demonstrations, Mr. Harry Jenkins M.H.R. welcomed everyone to Australia and declared the competition open, which was symbolised by Br. Brian Thomas casting out the original King Billy Hook boomerang (made 1850) which Ralph and Stephen Sinclair brought along for the occasion.

A bit of philosophising:

To me the unwritten policy has always seemed to be that our use of boomerangs is of a purely scientific or sporting nature with no involvement on a cultural level. But in addition to this is the fellowship and feeling of brotherhood that has grown between people from all walks of life that have a common interest in mankind's first "flying machine". Now, with most appropriate timing at the beginning of a new millenium, the world wide *boomerang fraternity* has symbolically embraced the *Aboriginal culture and matured to another level*.

P.S. I hope that Australia will be hosting the World Cup in 2010.

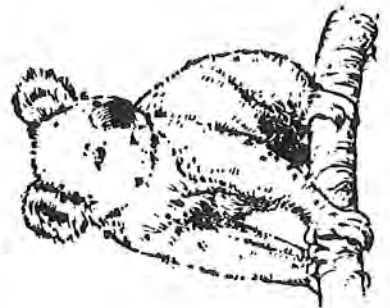
